Course Purpose: The goal of this course is to prevent hepatitis B illness in workers who may be exposed to materials that may contain the hepatitis B virus (HBV) by providing workers with information to support their decision regarding receipt of the HBV vaccination.

Course Objectives:

1. Recall who must complete medical surveillance for Hepatitis B virus (HBV)
2. Recognize HBV health effects
3. Identify occupational exposures and procedures
4. Identify the benefits, safety and risks of vaccination
5. Recall the process for completing your HBV medical surveillance

Performance Criteria: Employees will be asked to demonstrate what they have learned from the web-based training by taking a brief quiz at the end of the course.
